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Ash Wednesday Worship

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We were joined by Reverend Graham this week to celebrate Ash Wednesday (a little early as it is on the 14th February). Children learnt about the significance of this day as it begins the season of Lent. During Lent, many Christians, and people of no faith, try to make changes to become better versions of themselves. Christians believe that this represents the sacrifices Jesus made in the desert.





Reverend Graham, the local vicar, came into the school on Thursday morning to teach us about Ash Wednesday. He taught us about Lent and that 40 is a special number in the Bible .Christians get ready for Easter during the 40 days before. He also taught us that the ash comes from burning your palms from the previous year. Christians wear these ashes on their head to show that they are sorry. He demonstrated this on two Year 6 children.



Responsible Decision-Making, e.g. self-discipline, reasoned judgement, problem-solving, evaluate consequences of actions.

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
