Christian Distinctiveness

This week I have been reflecting on what makes us a 'Church of England' school. Some of you may have an idea based on your own schooling, for others it may be something you have not considered before. Here are some of the aspects, which define us as a C of E school:

- We have a Christian vision (As a family, we flourish), rooted in theology (Love each other as I have loved you, John 15:12). We are part of the Diocese of Gloucester Academy Trust and our vision resonates with the wider Trust vision, 'To enable all to flourish'.
- Our vision is lived out through our Christian values (Compassion, Humility, Respect, Truth, Courage and Forgiveness)
- The Local Governing Body ensure I am committed, with the help of staff, to maintain the Christian character of the school.
- We have daily Collective Worship (what you may remember as 'assembly') and provide further opportunities for prayer and reflection during the school day. Collective Worship is inspiring, inclusive and invitational.
- We observe and celebrate Christian festivals in school and St Bartholomew's Church.
- We maintain and develop an active and affirming relationship with the Parish of Coaley
- We welcome children of all faiths, and none, and ensure those children of other faiths are able to celebrate their major festivals with integrity.
- Spirituality is a large part of school life and children use language such as 'ows, wows & nows' to define spiritual moments.
- We are inspected by an organisation called 'SIAMS' every few years, who check that our vision, values and curriculum (including Religious Education) enable all of our children to grow and flourish.
- We are supported by the Diocesan Board of Education who offer support, advice, training and CPD.

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ClassDojo

During the parent coffee afternoon, several of you requested information about the Class Dojo system. Although Dojos are used in all classes, they are used more frequently in Starlings and Owls. Children receive Dojos to recognise and celebrate academic achievements (such as reading five times in a week, completing homework, times tables success etc.). The children collectively earn points for a desired treat; this is chosen together at the start of each term. The target number of Dojos changes each term depending on the term length. In addition to Dojos, children will receive house points to recognise that they have demonstrated one of our six core Christian values. House points are revealed by house captains during our weekly Celebration Worship and contribute towards a reward at the end of each term for the wining house.

<u>Coaley TableTop Sale</u>



<u>Head Lice</u>

We continue to have reports of head lice in school. Please check your child's hair as soon as possible and monitor additional itching or movement in their hair. Here are some top tips to help reduce outbreaks:

- Check your child's hair once a week.
- Use a proper detection comb- with teeth no more than 0.3mm apart to trap head lice. The comb is usually white in colour so that lice can be easily identified.
- If you find live lice, treatments can be purchased in supermarkets and pharmacies.
