Impact

As part of the local sports network we attended a number of organised events including the Cross Country, Tag rugby festival, Netball competition, District athletics (field and

track) and multi sports mini Olympics. In all events, we ensured as many pupils as possible had the opportunity to represent the school in a competitive environment.

Our biggest spend was on school development. We engaged with Atlas Sports to bring in specialised sports coaches to enhance our provision and provide real time CPD for staff. In doing so, we were able to boost staff confidence in delivering PE lessons and sports coaching eg. Rounders, athletics and netball. The same coaches were engaged to deliver Sports Clubs in line with the District Sport Fixtures to ensure pupils were coached and prepared for inter-school competitions. This increased participation in the events as well as pupil and staff confidence.
