CR will stay on as a Trust Governor, along with IB who will stay as an 'Associate Governor' to provide mentoring support for the new board for period of time. This will ensure continuity and consistency to the level of challenge and support the Governing Board have provided. DGAT & Gloucester Diocese are providing training opportunities for new Governors. A committee structure will be adopted under the LGB. There will be 2 committees: 1)Ethos & Standards 2) Finance & Resources; there will also be a Church Liaison group led by 1 x Foundation Governor to strengthen and develop links between the Church and School. A parent request that some children be supported & encouraged to speak more confidently as this is a good skill to develop. Parents asked that there is a system for monitoring who receives certificates each week to ensure all children are be recognised over time.
