Dear Parents and Carers,

First of all I'd like to warmly welcome you all back to school. As you can imagine, it's been a bit of a challenge to get all the things in place and ready to safely have all the children back in school, learning loads and having fun. I apologise if some of the guidance I sent out last week has since changed as the latest Government guidance came out quite late on Friday, and after I sent my letter last week. However, you have all seem to have adapted to our new situation very well so thank you.

We've already tweaked a few things as we learn lessons each day, especially with regards to the staggered start and finish times. For example, if you are waiting for the Starlings, please can you come into the fenced area at the front of the school to prevent blocking the pavement. Also, we realised an issue with the two classes finishing at the same time as there are some siblings in both classes. We are now asking for parents who have children in Starlings and another class to come to the other classroom at pick up as there is more space to socially distance, and we will make sure both your children are available to be collected. The updated Risk Assessment will be on the school website from Monday. Any problems with pick-ups or drop-offs, please see your class teacher or myself and we will solve any issues you have.

We have got lots of exciting things planned for the year and I will be sending out a summary of the plans soon, once I have shared this with the governors. Last year was quite extraordinary in lots of ways for us at Coaley but we managed to do some fantastic things. Here is what we have achieved from the last action plan: the playground is now ready for our grand launch next Friday (more news about that early next week); the library is now in place; the new logo is now a part of the Coaley family. We have also grown to three classes and have a waiting list in some year groups. It was a great year and this year will be equally good.

We are also updating our behaviour systems at school and are introducing dojo points! This is an easy, exciting way of sharing with you your child's successes at school and for you to communicate with your child's teacher about small issues and to ask simple questions. More information will go out about this and some of you might have received information from your child's class teachers. This should all be sorted early next week for all classes. I will send out more details about this later this term.

We will be discussing clubs and how we can operate them this term given the current COVID guidance. As you'd expect, it's not simple as we have to maintain social distancing and keep children in their 'bubbles' as much as we can. I will let you know more about this as soon as I can.

As always, if there's anything you want to discuss, we are always here to help and I am in school every day.
