Dear Parents and Carers,

I have been really impressed with the quality of maths teaching this week as Mrs Lowe and I took a really deep look at the teaching of maths across the school. We spoke to children, looked at books and saw learning in lessons. The children were very enthusiastic when talking about maths and they love the challenge, and learning from their mistakes! Learning mathematical fluency and knowing facts by heart is such an important skill to have and one which we will be concentrating on.

We will also be using this idea when we come to looking at homework with the teachers as there are some things you just can't practise enough, such as knowing your times-tables or practising reading. Quite simply: the more you practise something, the better you get at it!

Talking of getting better: we have been looking at our behaviour policy this term and seeing how our 6-Coaley values can help us focus on positive behaviours around school.
