Experiments with dyes! Workshops with Stroudwater Textile Trust

In these fabulous hands-on art & science workshops we'll use ingredients from the kitchen cupboard and discover the colours we can make with them. Sometimes there will be surprises! You will also be able to see eco printing and natural dyes created by volunteer Ruth Illingworth whose exhibition will be an inspiring backdrop for these sessions.

These workshops last around one hour and are great fun for curious children aged 8+ and their parents or grandparents. Please wear old clothes or bring an old apron, and book ahead to ensure you have a place.
