Dear Parent/Carers,

It has been a very busy couple of weeks since returning to school after the half term break. It was lovely to see so many of you at Coaley Fireworks and I am delighted to share that you helped to raise a phenomenal £1247 from the evening. Once again, I would like to share my huge appreciation to all involved behind the scenes, during the evening and volunteers who cleared the field on the following morning. It was a great example of our school family coming together to help one another flourish.

There have been lots of visits already this term and I was delighted to receive an invite from Cotswold Homes who are working on the 17-house development in the village. They kindly invited three Year 6 pupils to visit the site and hear all about the project development. Not only did they learn a lot about the materials and the process of a build, they were delighted to receive a second invite to the grand opening of the show house later in the spring term. Cotswold Homes have also asked for our children's help in designing the child's bedroom of the show house. More details will be circulated at the start of next term when we launch the competition.

I can't quite believe we have reached the first milestone of our reading recognition programme to celebrate all of the children who have read five times a week since the start of this academic year. As we approach the end of our tenth week, we will be celebrating all of the children who have earned 10 points and earned the first prize of a bookmark during our Celebration Worship later today.

Part of our Eco-Council's mission this term is to make our school a greener place. I am sure you will remember that they raised funds last term to purchase bulbs, plants, bug hotels and lots more to help with this mission. We will be visiting Highfield Garden World later this morning to purchase these goods. Highfields have already very kindly donated a mass of daffodil bulbs, compost and pots for every child to plant. Last week, during lunchtime, children were invited to plant bulbs which will flower in springtime. I would like to say a huge thank you to Highfield Garden World for their generous donation and accommodating our visit later this morning- the Eco-Council have been particularly excited about this!

Some of you may remember the special Advent Calendar at the community shop last year. This year, the children of our school have been asked to be part of this special countdown to Christmas. Each class has been given a special Christmas mission to design a particular bauble design to go behind a door of the calendar. 
- 37 of our pupils have 100% attendance




